Manvers Lake was created in the 1990s as part of the remediation project to allow former industrial land to be redeveloped for commercial, housing and leisure purposes.

Today the site is owned and managed by Manvers Lake & Dearne Valley Trust and is home to the thriving Manvers Waterfront Boat Club. With beautiful scenery and an abundance of wildlife it is also a great place to immerse yourself in nature.

WILDLIFE

The lake and surrounding woodland, hedgerows and fields are home to a great many species of birds and mammals. The Dearne Valley Wetlands has been designated a SSSI (Site of Special Interest) in part for its breeding Willow Tit population, which is currently the most endangered species of resident bird and the project hopes to ensure it is saved from extinction.



We have a great little takeaway café on-site which offers a selection of drinks and snacks. From hot drinks and bacon sandwiches to ice creams and juice, whatever the weather we can keep you fed and hydrated. We have on-site toilets and the Boathouse has rooms available to hire out.
